

### Slavery in History...

- World history is filled with various types of slavery.
  - o Hebrew servanthood.
  - o Roman slavery.
  - o Indentured servitude.
  - o African slave trade.
- Biblical history is filled with various perspectives on slavery.
  - o Slavery is not a part of creation; it is a product of sin.
  - Specific situations in a sinful world warrant specific instructions to a sinful world
  - Biblical instructions concerning slavery do not imply biblical <u>approval</u> of slavery.

#### Slavery in Scripture...

- The Bible condemns slavery.
  - o Slavery that undermines God's creation.
    - We have equal <u>dignity</u> before God.
    - We are equally <u>submissive</u> to God.
    - We will receive equal <u>justice</u> from God.
  - Slavery that violates God's Word.
    - The Bible denounces physical abuse.
    - The Bible denounces human trafficking.
- The Bible regulates slavery.
  - o God mandates physical protection for slaves.
  - o God requires financial provision for slaves.
  - o God ensures caring supervision of slaves.
- $\circ$  God promotes (and in some ways guarantees) eventual  $\underline{\text{freedom}}$  from slavery.
- The Bible encourages slaves.
  - o Honor unbelieving masters.
    - For the glory of <u>God</u>.
    - For the advancement of the gospel.
      - Christianity is not aimed primarily at social <u>reform</u>.
      - Christianity is aimed primarily at personal redemption.
  - o Respect believing masters.
    - Work wholeheartedly.
    - Serve selflessly.
- The Bible redeems slavery.
  - o The beauty of Christ...
    - Our Master has become our <u>servant</u>.
  - o The essence of Christianity...
    - We gladly become His slave.
